

## About the sports premium at One Degree Academy

At One Degree Academy, we are strongly committed to PE and recognise the contribution of PE and sport to the health and wellbeing of our children. Additionally, we believe that an innovative, varied and immersive PE curriculum has a positive influence on concentration, attitude and academic achievement. We realise that knowledge without character is pointless, and are committed to providing our children with multiple contexts in which to develop character attributes. This is at the heart of our STRIVE curriculum - an approach which integrates enrichment opportunities for all students.

Our Sports Premium Funding will help us to continue to provide this provision and ensure that we have professionals and specialists who can broaden horizons for our children and develop a sense of enjoyment in the areas on offer.

Schools are required to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and Sport, but they have the freedom to choose how they do this.

### Context

- One Degree opened with 1 form of reception children in September 2016 in temporary accommodation, housed within another school site.
- The temporary nature of our site provides limited access to facilities for the sole use of One Degree. The school has limited access to another school's sporting facilities.
- 43% of ODA pupils live in one of the 10% most deprived postcodes in the UK (IDACI)
- 85% of ODA pupils live in one of the 20% most deprived postcodes in the UK (IDACI)
- All ODA pupils live in one of the 40% most deprived postcodes in the UK (IDACI)

Total amount of Sports Premium received for 17/18 was £16,230
